21 February 1945	Two night-fighters contacted, fired at, and lost contact with an enemy snooper near the Task Force.
22 February	The squadron joined in one support strike in the amphibious operations at Iwo Jima.
25 February	Two fighter sweeps were launched against Hyakuri- gahara, Hokoda, and Mawatari Airfields near Tokyo, Japan. Rescue, Tank Group, and Radar Picket Line combat air patrols were flown. Lieut. Norman W. Sandler, USNR, was lost over the target. Late in the afternoon a third fighter sweep took off to attack the Hachijo Jima Airfields. Seven enemy planes were shot down during the day.
26 February	Planned operations against Nagoya were cancelled due to poor weather, and the Task Force retired during the night.
1 March	USS RANDOLPH anchored at Ulithi Atoll.
9-10 March	Simulated combat operations were conducted.
11 March	USS RANDOLPH was the victim of a suiciding FRANCES No VF 12 personnel were casualties.
15-31 March	Alternating duty between other squadrons of the Air Group, VF 12 was temporarily land based at the Marine Air Base, Falalop Island, Ulithi Atoll. During this time the squadron participated in four attacks on Yap Island (March 16, 18, 21, 22), and in flying combat air patrols. Ensign Delbert L. Martin, USNR, was lost at Yap on 21 March, presumably to antiaircraft fire.
1-3 April	USS RANDOLPH and Air Group TWELVE conducted a three-day shakedown exercise following completion of the ship's repairs.

From the time of sortie from Ulithi until return to Leyte, P.I., daily combat air patrols were maintained. These are not listed hereinafter unless their activity warrants mention. One some days during the cruise in the active combat area CAP's were the only flights launched, hence some dates will show no offensive missions though the squadron was engaged in operations along the Ryukyus.

Five replacement pilots reported aboard for duty.

USS RANDOLPH sortied from Ulithi Atoll and pro-

ceeded to rejoin Task Force 58 in support of the

Okinawa operations.
